
CITY ASSEMBLY HOUSE VENUE HIRE

An elegant 18th-century exhibition and events venue in Dublin city centre

The City Assembly House, located on historic South William Street in Dublin's South Georgian Core, was built between 1765-71 by the Society of Artists in Ireland, as the first public exhibition gallery in Ireland and Britain.

Over the course of its 250 year history the City Assembly House has hosted a wide variety of events and we now invite you to continue the tradition of entertaining and exhibiting here. By choosing the City Assembly House for your event, you are actively supporting the care of this significant 18th-century building and the work of the Irish Georgian Society.

The City Assembly House has three rooms available for hire within walking distance of St Stephen's Green, College Green, Dame, Dawson and Grafton Street.







KNIGHT OF GLIN EXHIBITION ROOM

Built by the Society of Artists in Ireland from 1765-66, this octagonal shaped exhibition room served as the first purpose built public exhibition gallery in Ireland and Britain. The refurbished octagonal Knight of Glin Exhibition Room is the centrepiece of the building, and is named for Desmond FitzGerald, the 29th and last Knight of Glin and longstanding President of the Irish Georgian Society.

With a capacity of up to 90 people seated, it offers a chance for intimate recitals, performances, conferences and lectures. With the seating removed the gallery becomes a grand and imposing exhibition space suitable for book and product launches, musical performances, filming, and canapé and wine receptions.

DANIEL O'CONNELL ROOM

Named for Daniel O'Connell, who was elected in the City Assembly House as the first Catholic Lord Mayor of Dublin for nearly 200 years. This room extends across the first floor level and functions as an elegant gallery space and offers a long functional space suitable for board meetings, corporate seminars, training workshops, book launches and small receptions. It also offers a complementary space for events in the Knight of Glin Exhibition Room. The ceiling is decorated with original plasterwork by Charles Thorpe, former Lord Mayor of Dublin (1800-1) and celebrated stuccodore.

SIMON VIERPYL ROOM

On ground floor level opposite the Society's bookshop is a small meeting room, named for the Irish sculptor Simon Vierpyl (1725-1810), who was a member of the Society of Artists in Ireland, the pioneering group of artists who originally built the City Assembly House between 1765-71.

This room, overlooking the vibrant South William Street and Coppinger Row area, is suitable for small meetings and also serves as an exhibition space, equipped with a brass rail hanging system. This room may serve as a complementary space to other events in the City Assembly House, functioning as a green room or cloakroom.
